Subject: Criminal Complaint by the Treatment Information Group against Treatment Action Campaign Leader “Zackie” Achmat

On January 4, 2007 the Treatment Information Group (TIG) served a draft bill of indictment at the International Criminal Court in The Hague applying for the prosecution of Treatment Action Campaign (TAC) leader “Zackie” Achmat on charges of genocide for his direct criminal role in the deaths of thousands of South Africans from antiretroviral (ARV) drug poisoning.

The Dr Rath Health Foundation Africa (the Foundation) supports the campaigning educational work of the TIG in exposing the tissue of lies and half truths that is continually spun around AIDS by pharmaceutical interests supporting the exclusive use of toxic ARV drugs.

Indeed, the Foundation’s own pioneering research work in the area of the natural control of diseases has already led to the realization that the course of AIDS can be reversed by these natural, non-toxic approaches.

In this light, it is particularly malicious that ARVs are being promoted to AIDS patients with the false promise of curing immune deficiencies, while it is widely known that the first organ system being destroyed by toxic ARVs is the immune system itself, thereby aggravating immune deficiencies and worsening AIDS.

There clearly exists a need for those promoting toxic ARV drugs – and thereby deliberately expanding the AIDS epidemic for marketing purposes – to be brought to account in a court of international law. The TIG and its founder, Advocate Anthony Brink have done the people of South Africa and the world a great service in bringing this Complaint before the International Criminal Court (ICC) in The Hague.

Whilst the Foundation is of the opinion that the Complaint could better have been made against the TAC as an organization, rather than focussing on the figure of Achmat – since there are many other TAC individuals equally culpable – nevertheless, there should be no doubt that it is entirely valid and long overdue.

Perhaps now, following the service of the TIG indictment and the Foundation’s own Complaint lodged with the ICC in June 2003, the courts may begin to bring to an end the AIDS genocide occurring in South Africa and many other countries.
